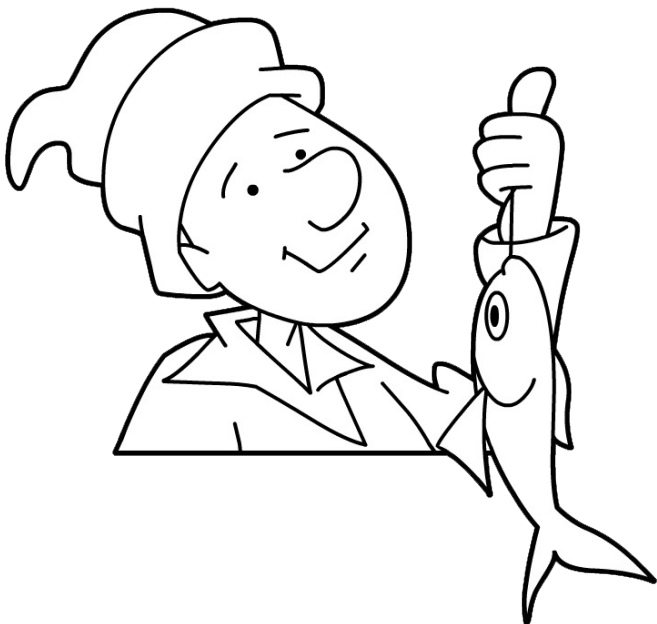

Everyone has some kind of work.

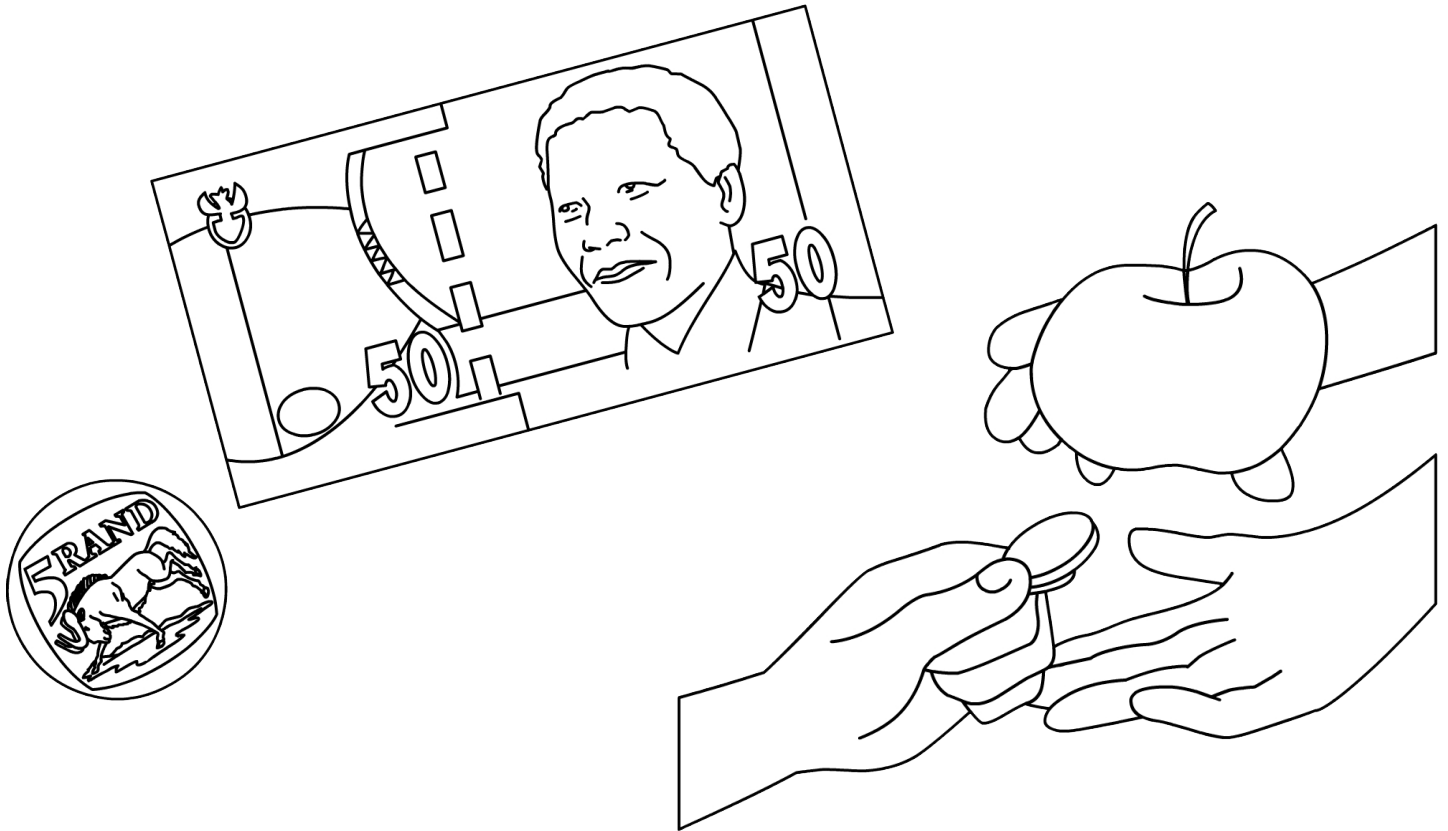


Another word for work is 'job'.

To have money, one has to earn it from the work or job we do.



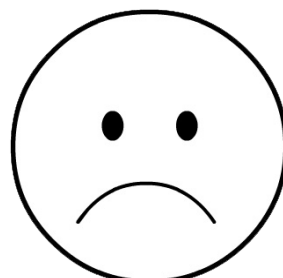
Even animals work, so they can eat.

The work or job they do helps people too.

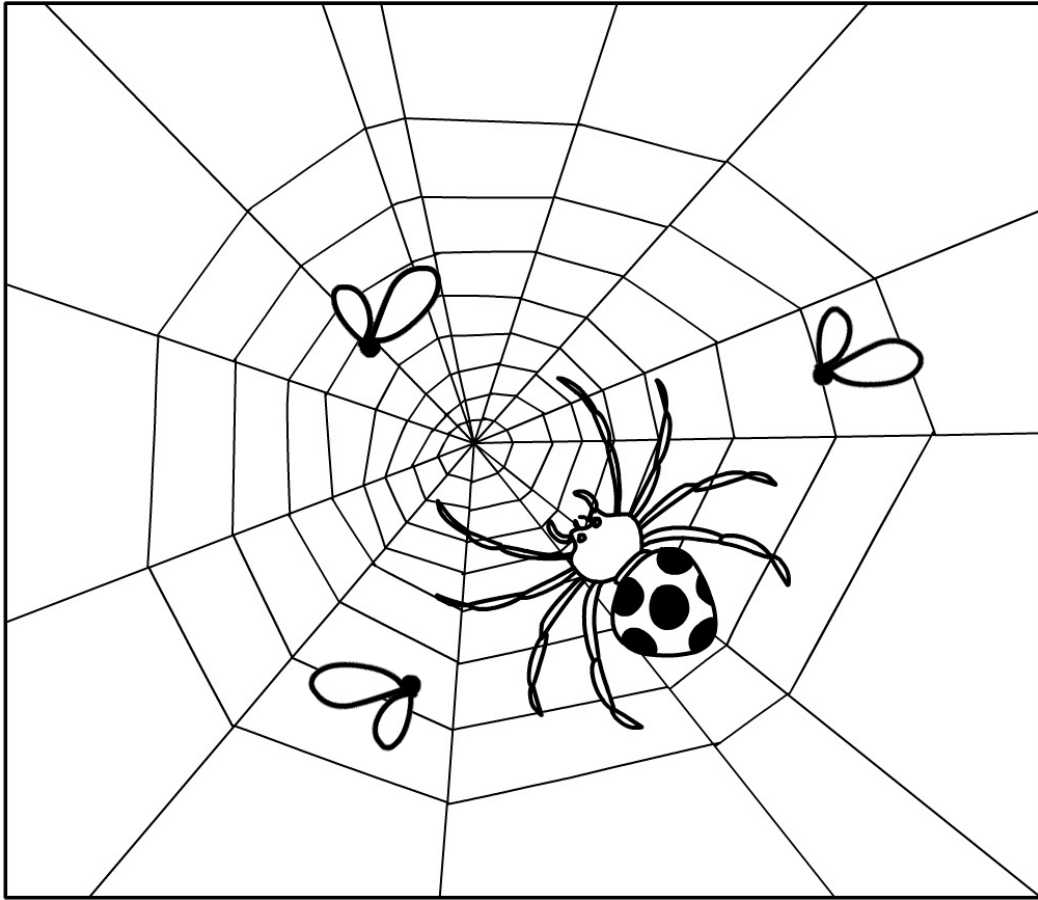

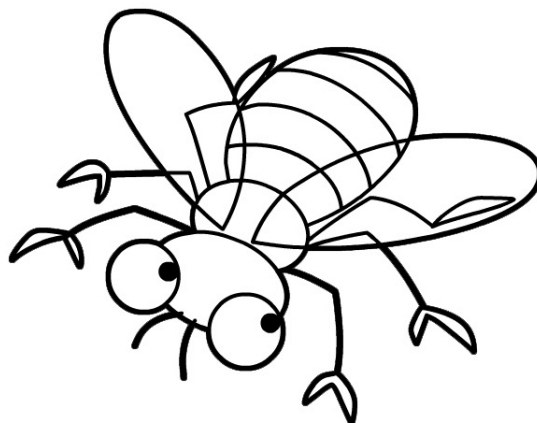


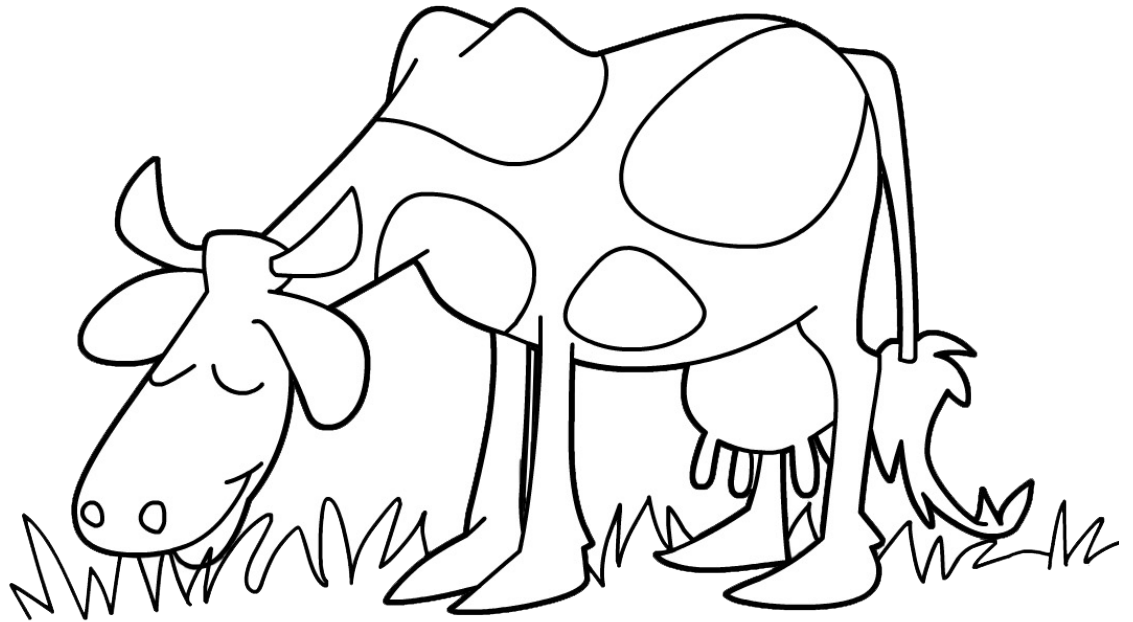
A spider's job is to spin a web. It takes time, energy and skill to spin a web

By doing its work, spiders also help us, keep flies out of our homes. That keeps us healthy.





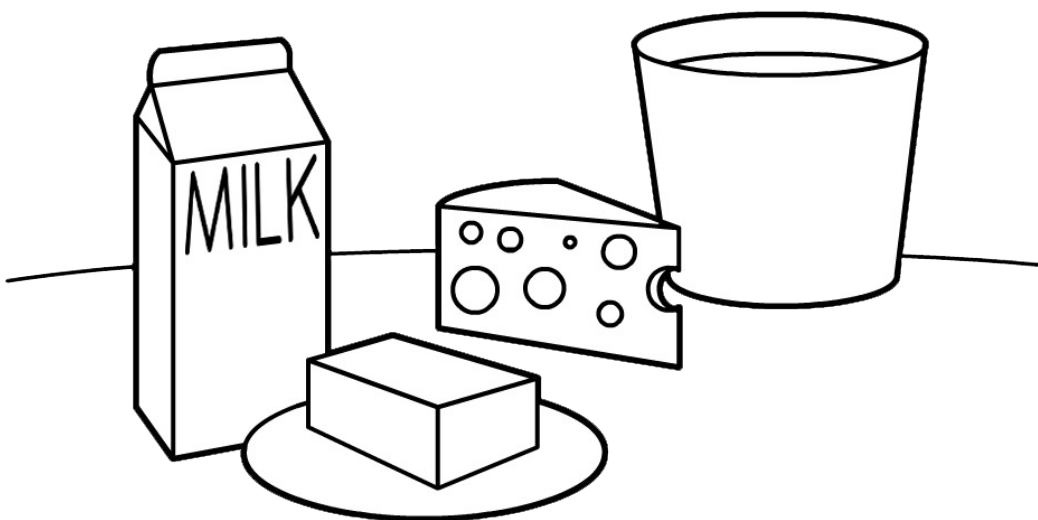
A cow's job is to make milk.

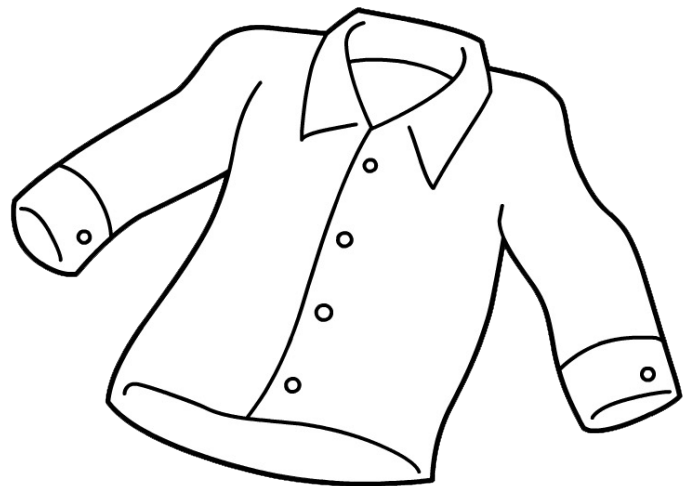
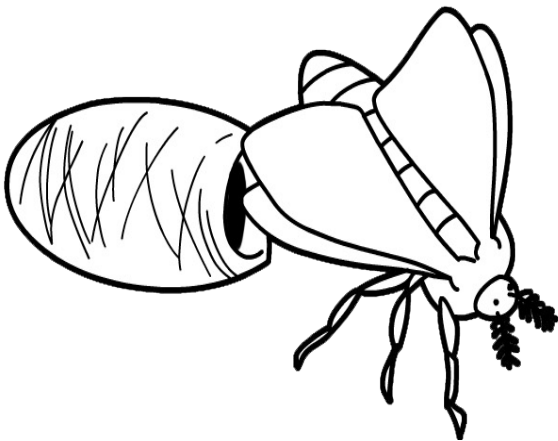
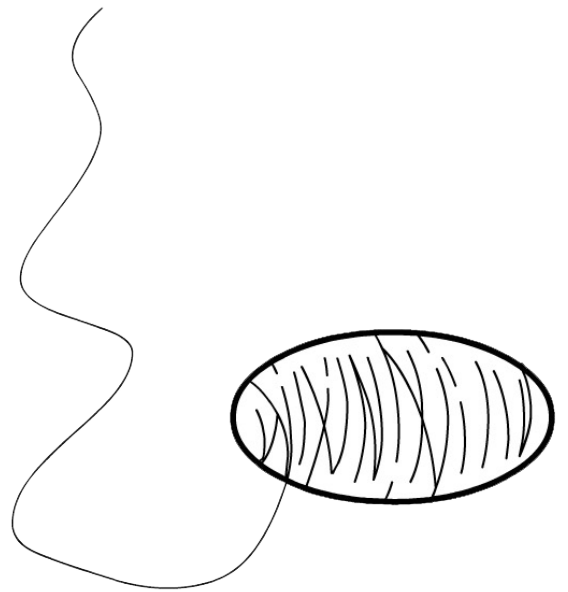
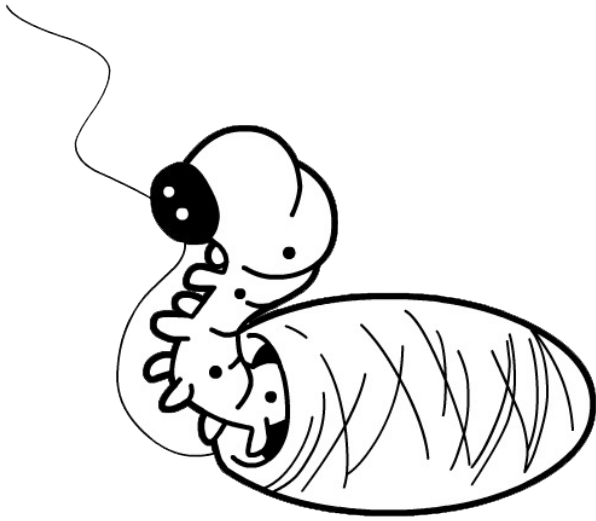
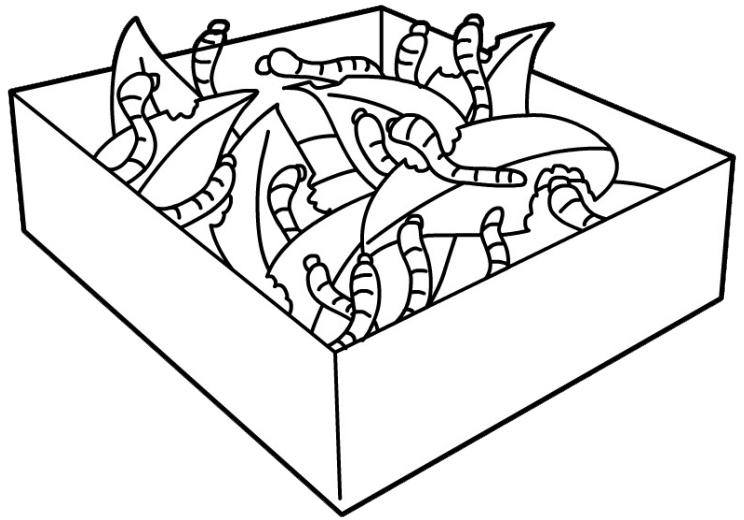
Milk is made when the cow eats grass.

The silkworm goes into its cocoon, to LIVE as a moth.

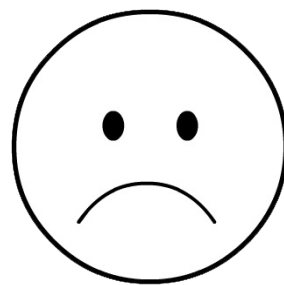
Its work gives people material to make clothing.

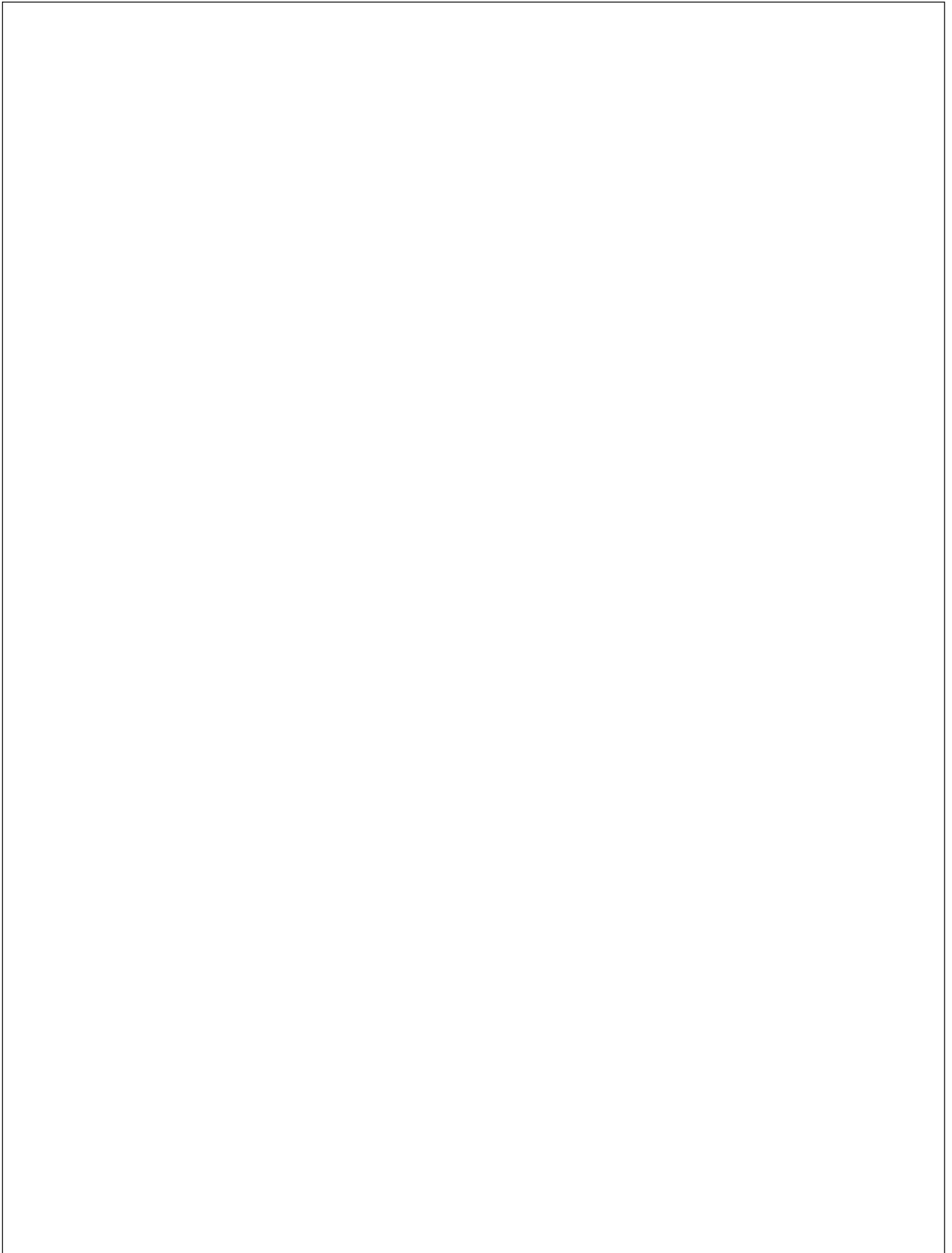

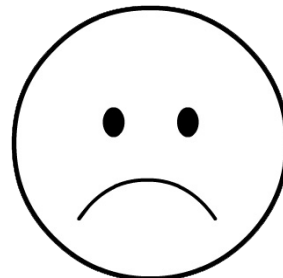

All honest work should be respected.

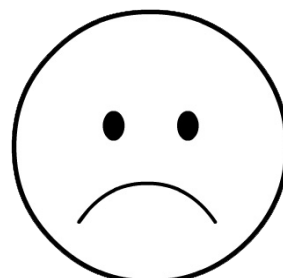
Honest work means doing what you can without taking what belongs to others.

No work or job is more valued than another.

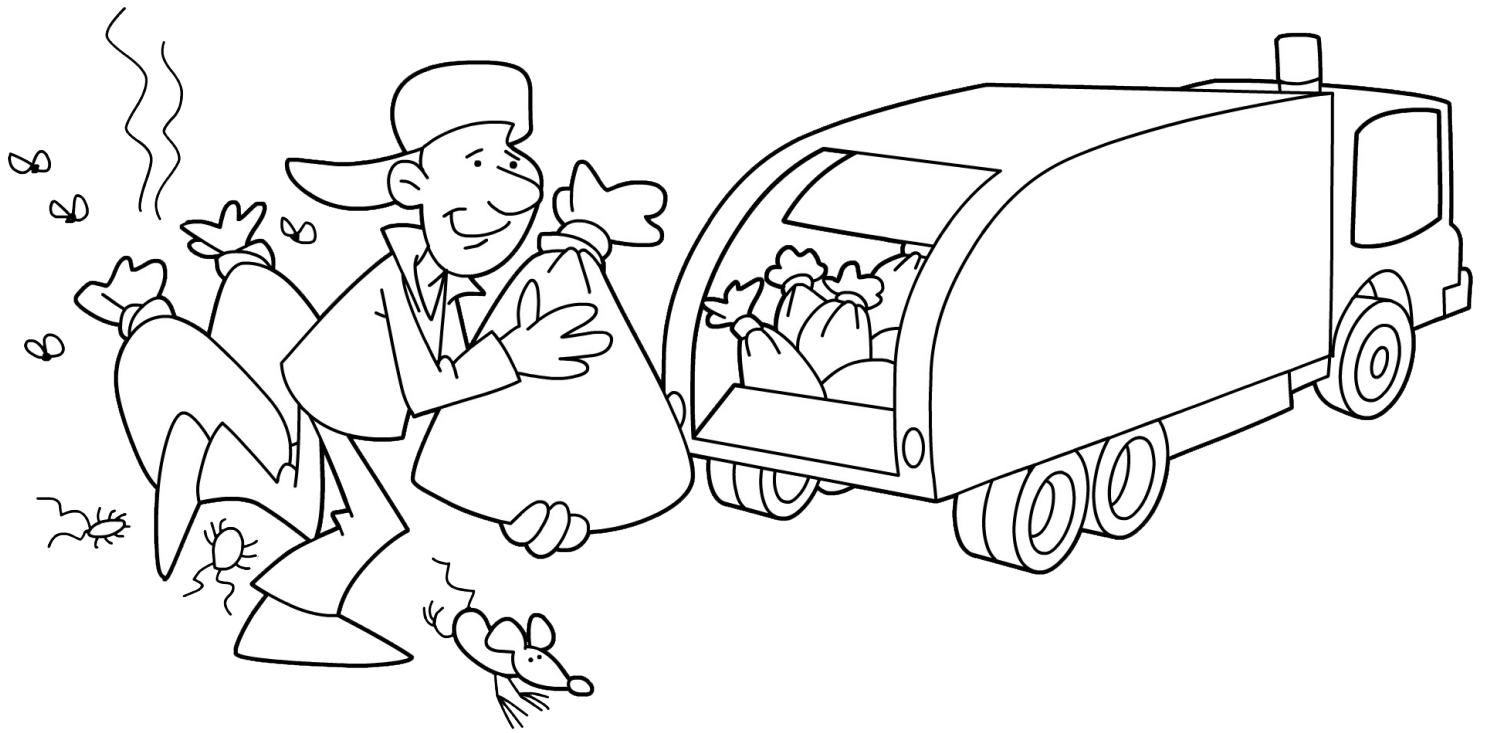

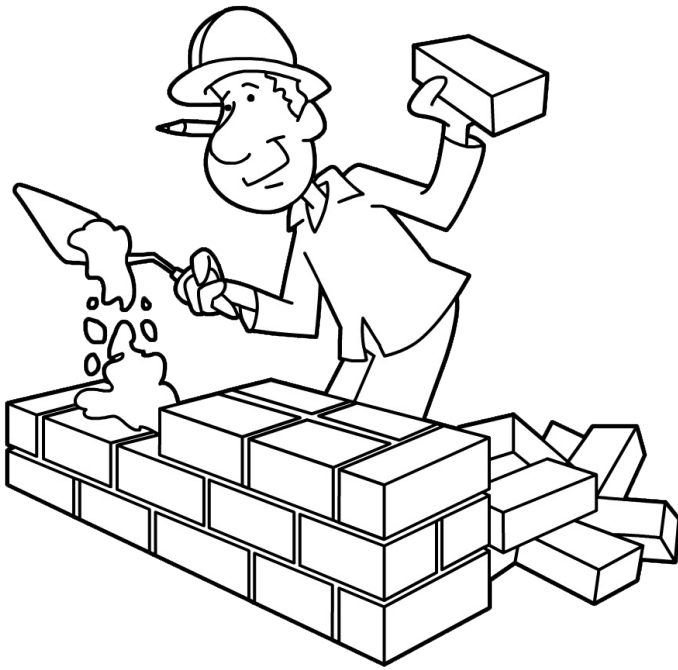


A doctor's work is important too. The doctor's job helps bring in money for their food. It also helps us keep healthy and well.

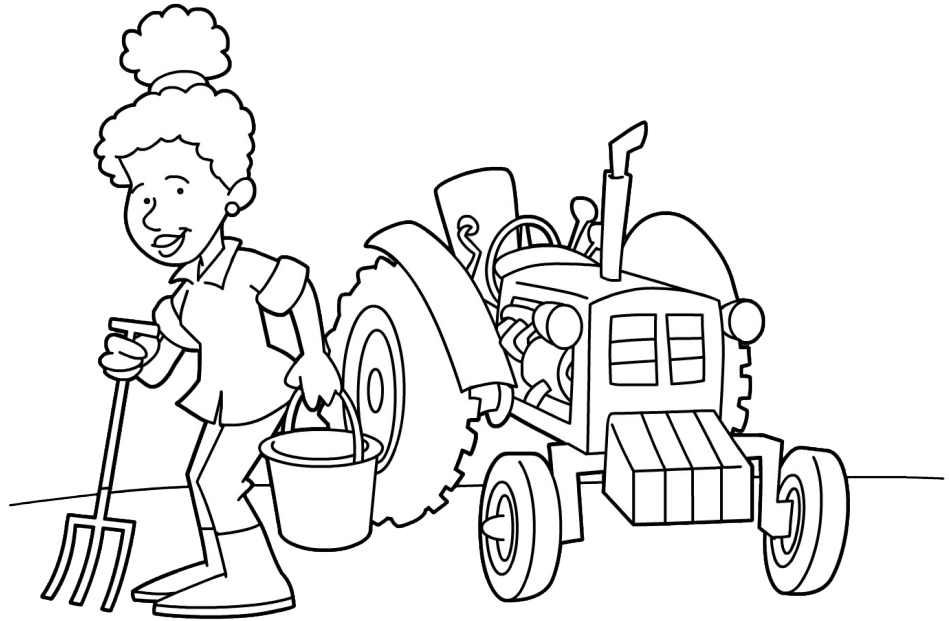






Jobs that help me eat

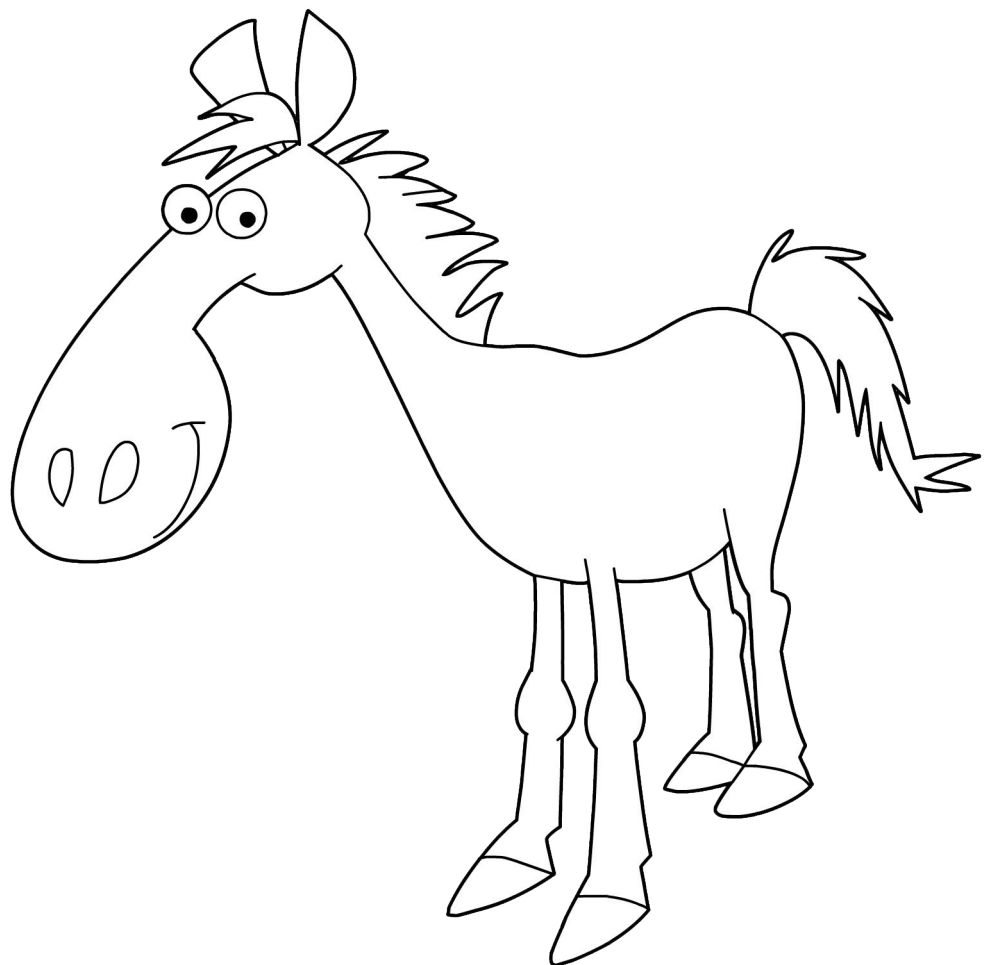
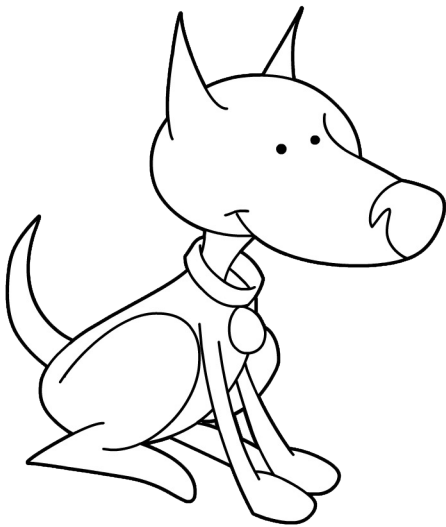
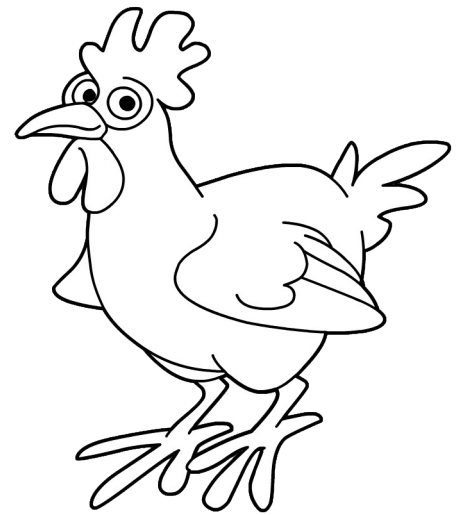
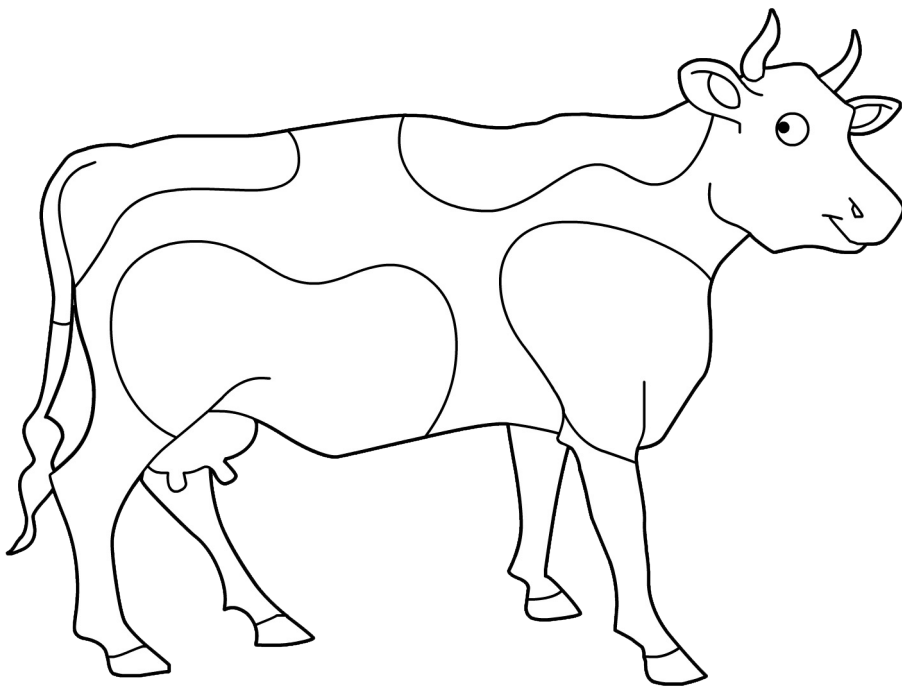
Life on the farm

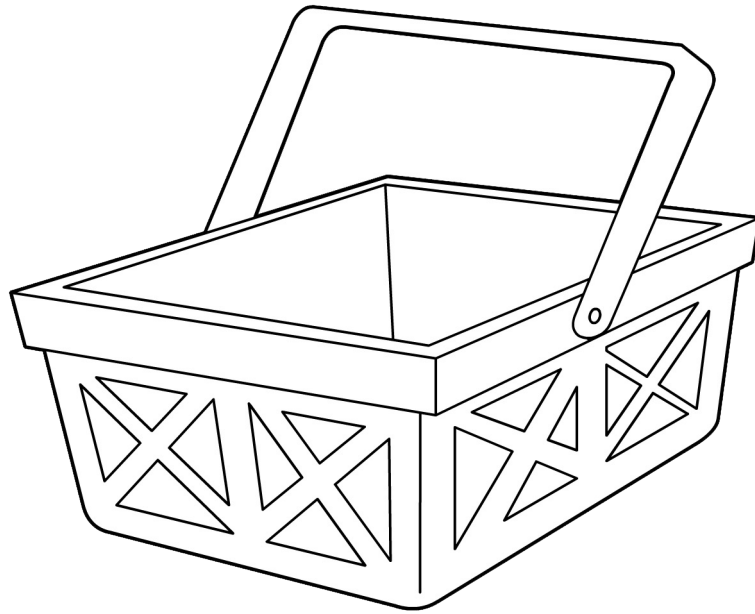

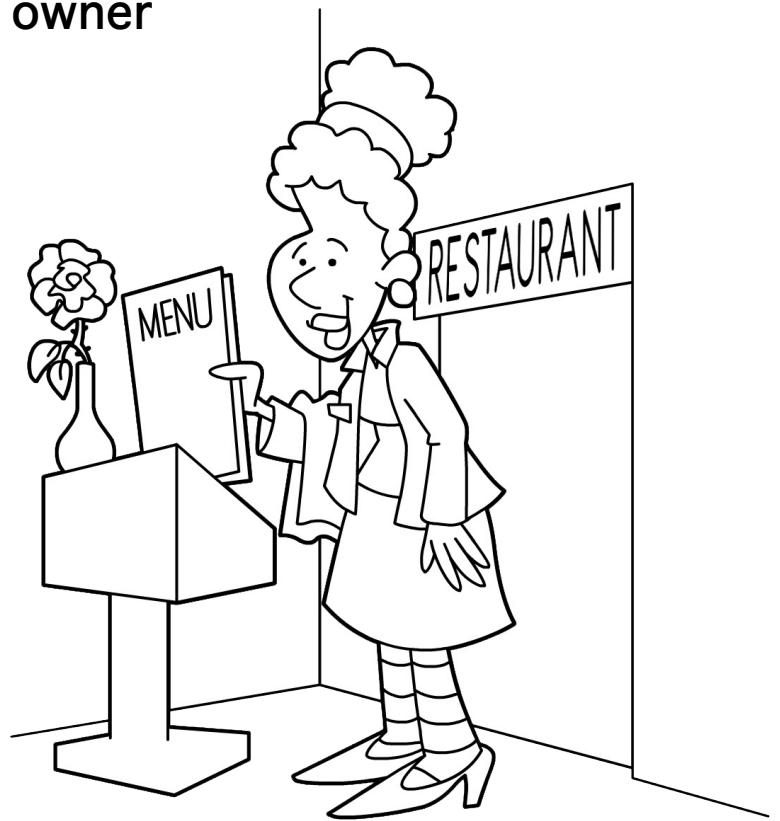
Chef

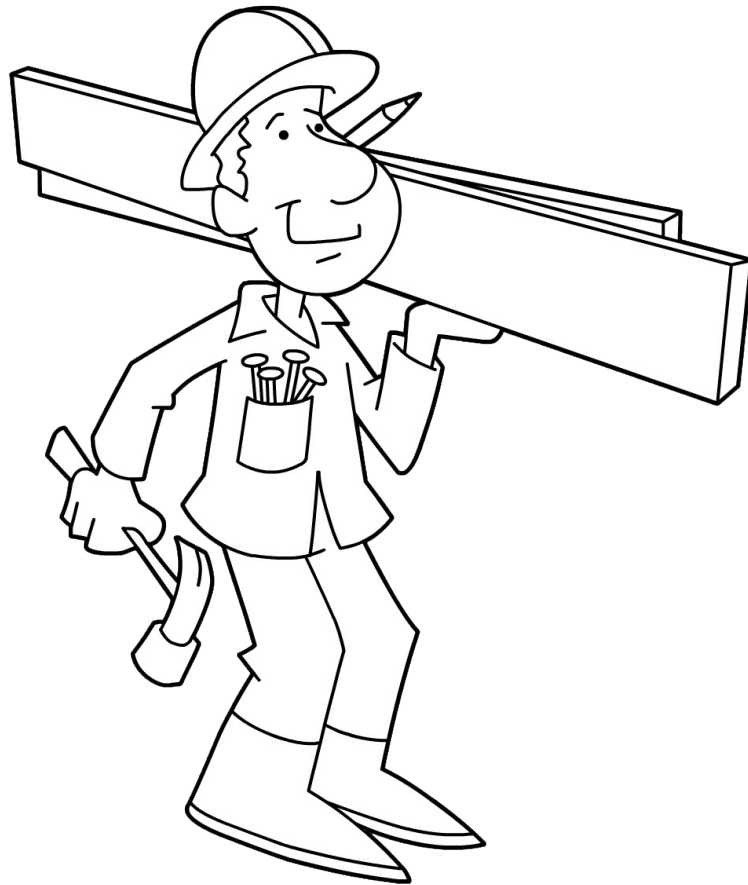
Service jobs: Trades

Many people can cut meat like a butcher, or cook like a chef, but only trained people can fix a tap, or a light or build a house.

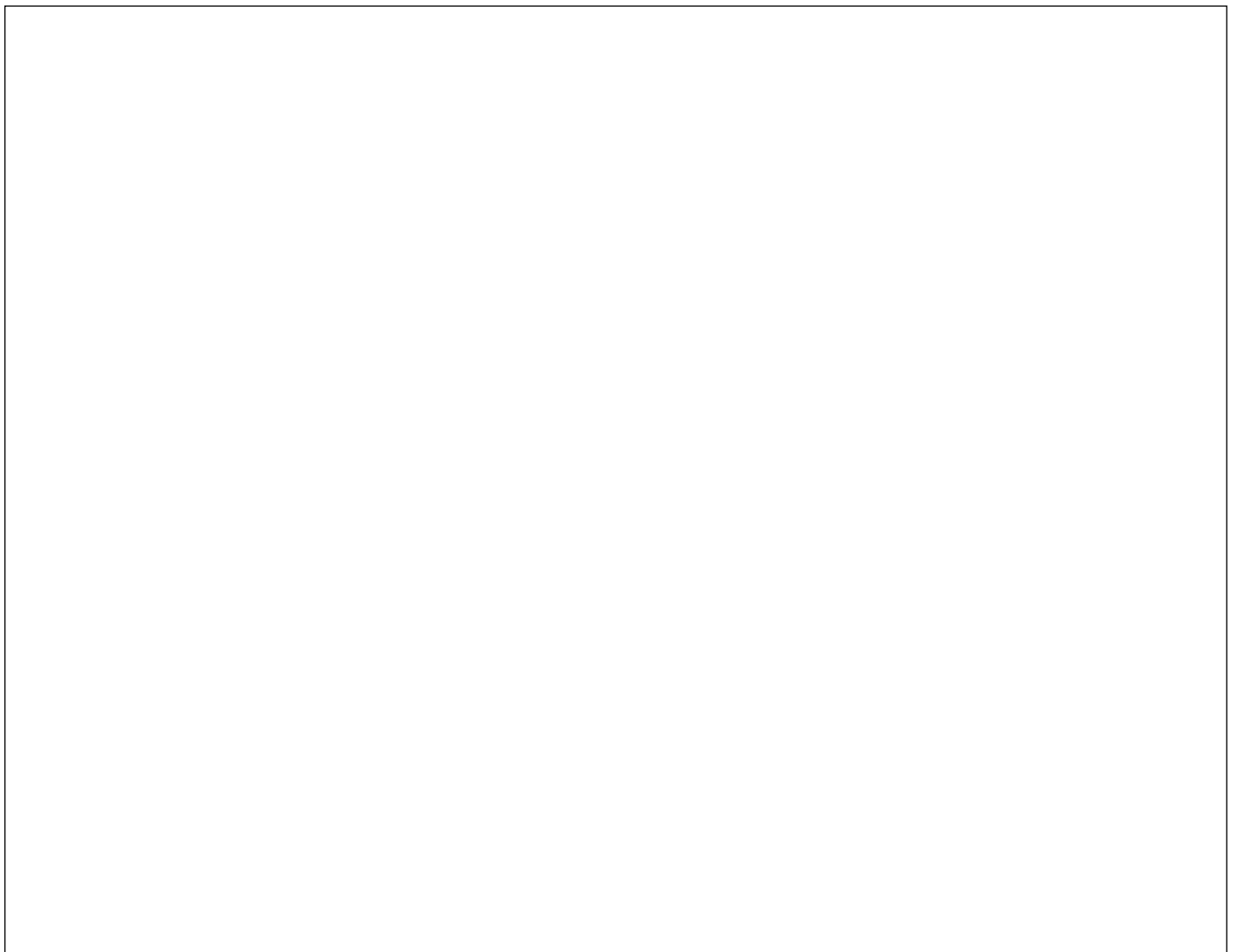
This is a builder. He builds houses. Draw a house.



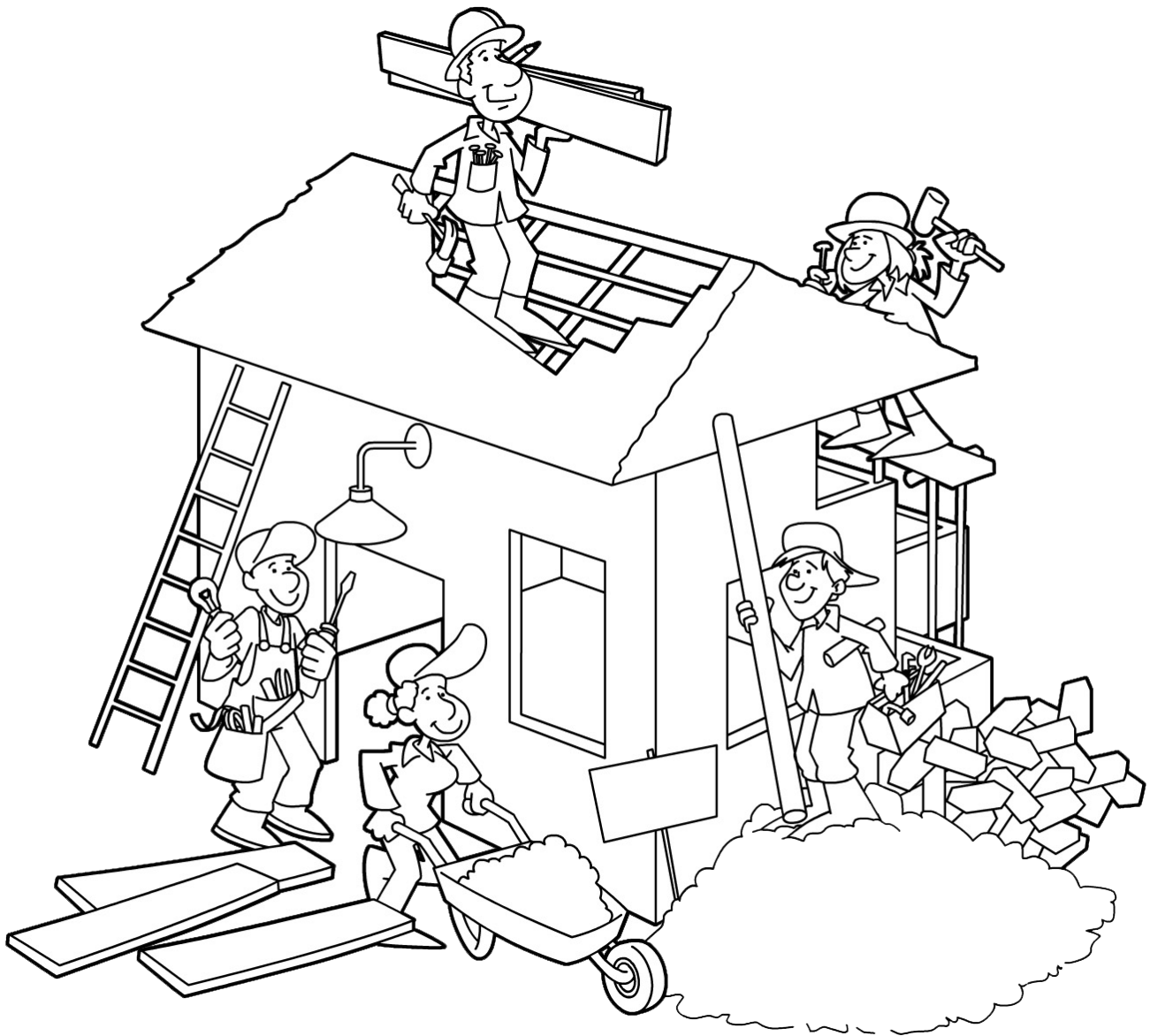
This is an electrician. He fixes plugs and lights. Draw a lamp.

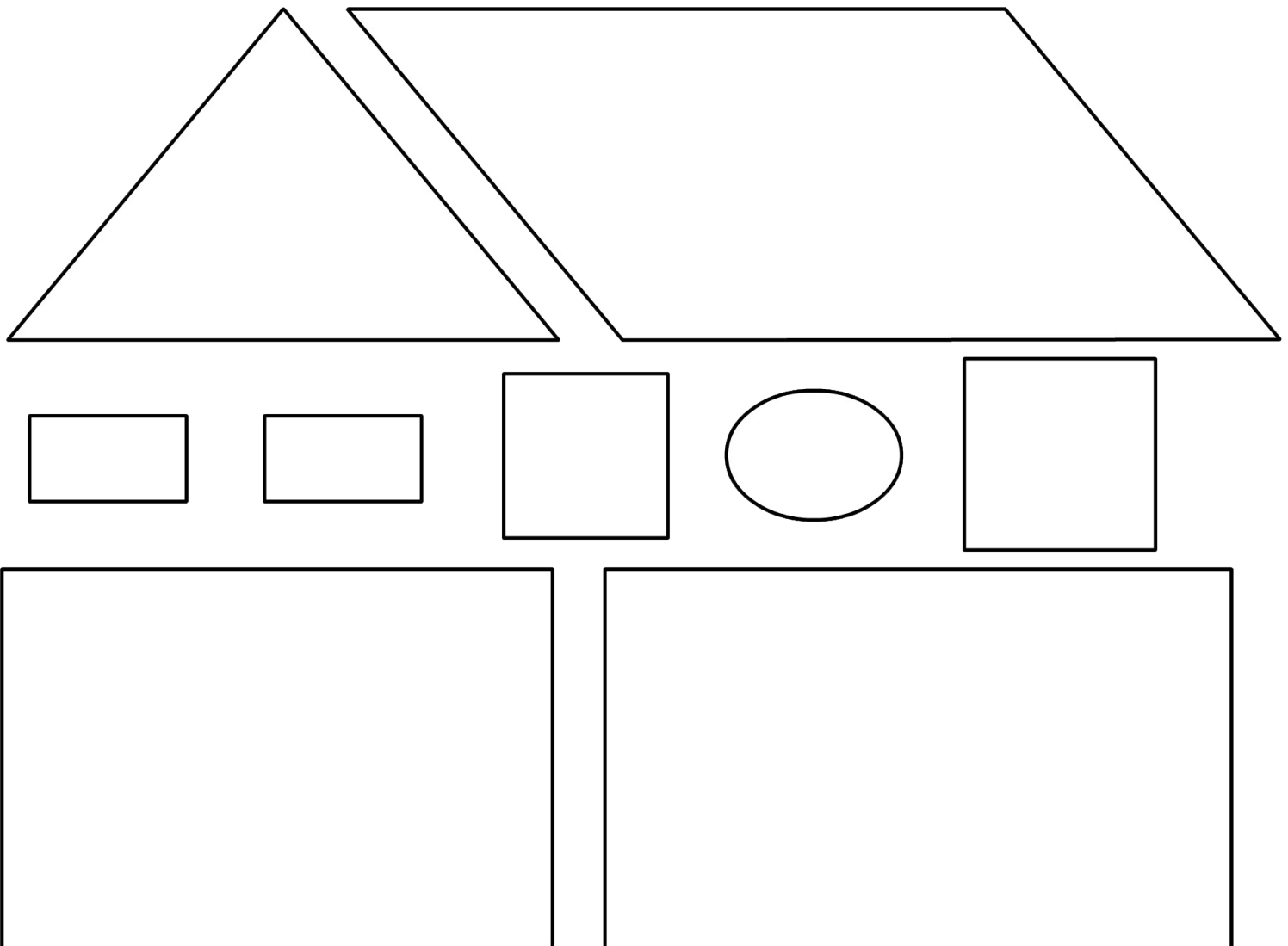

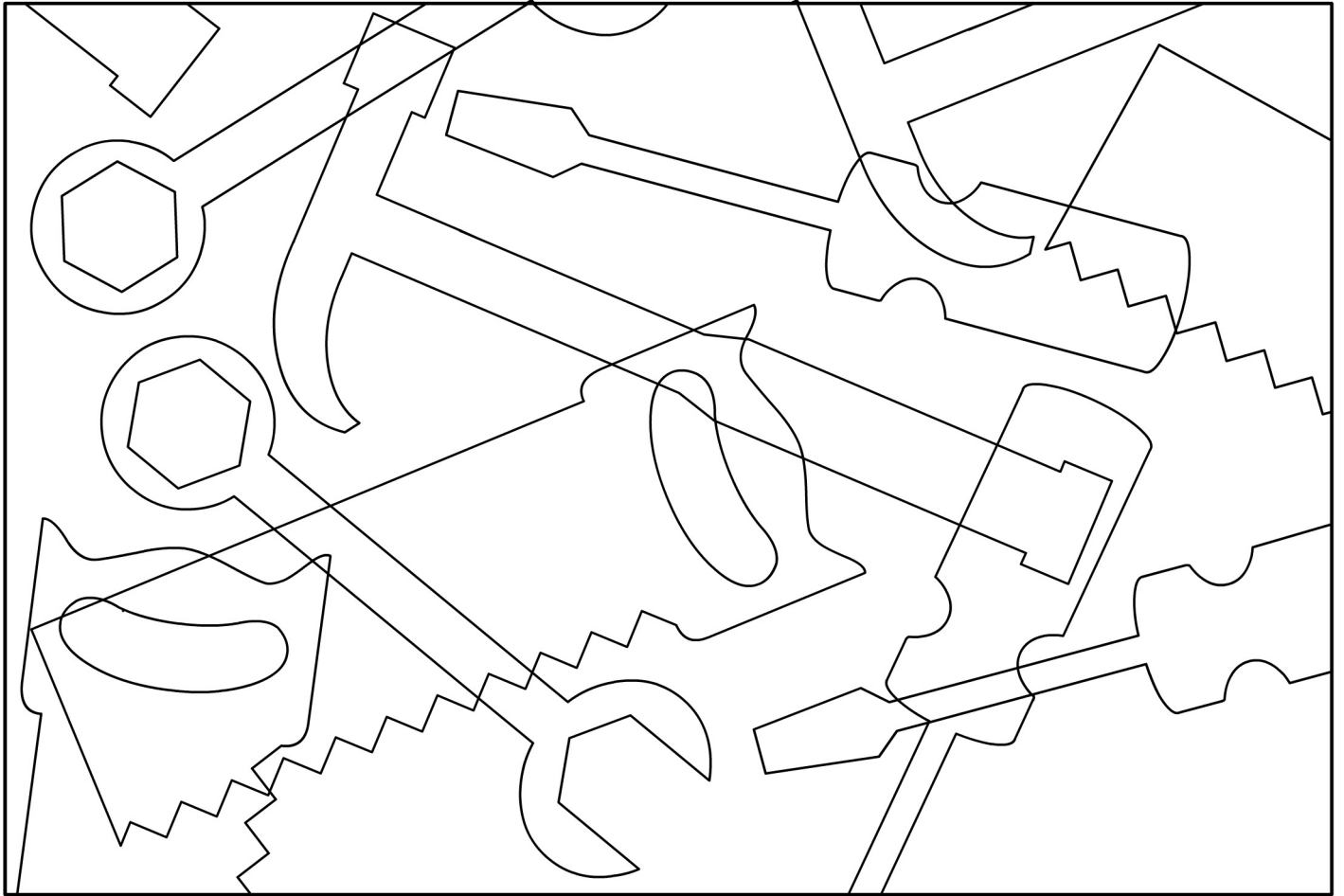
